Staff was seeking authorization to solicit bids for Roadside Mowing and Litter Removal Services along I2 (US83) and FM 396 (Anzalduas Hwy). Bid included Labor, materials, machinery & equipment and disposal services. Contract terms would be for one year with two-one year renewal options.

Staff and City Manager recommended approval.

Councilman Plata moved to authorize to Solicit for bids for Roadside Mowing and Litter Removal Services, as recommended by staff. Motion was seconded by Councilwoman Ochoa and approved unanimously 4-0.

4.10 Approval of Supplemental Work for Work Authorization No. 8 with Melden & Hunt related to the Waste Water Treatment Plant (WWTP) – Reuse Line Easement Acquisition

Supplemental Work Authorization No. 8 entailed professional services for WWTP – Reuse Line Easement Acquisition. This service consists of obtaining necessary easements acquisition and necessary permits for the proposed reuse water line. 13 easements would need to be acquired as part of this project on various parcels of land.

4.16 Authorization to enter into a Interlocal Agreement between the Rio Grande Valley Communications Group and the City of Mission for the installation of P25 radio antenna system

The Mission Police Department was requesting to enter into a Interlocal Agreement with the Rio Grande Valley Communications Group for the placement of a P25 radio antenna at Military Hwy. and Bryan Road. Rio Grande Valley Communications Group had agreed with the City of Mission Police Department conditions. This agreement would enable the Mission Police Department to cover a larger area of communications within our city limits.

Staff and City Manager recommended approval.

Councilman Plata moved to authorize to enter into a Interlocal Agreement between the Rio Grande Valley Communications Group and the City of Mission for the installation of P25 radio antenna system, as recommended by staff. Motion was seconded by Councilwoman Ochoa and approved unanimously 4-0.

Under Texas Government Code Chapter 607 was a presumption that certain illnesses or injuries were presumed to have occurred while in the line of duty. The City of Mission intends to provide temporary relief to a firefighter who had complied with the workers' compensation act but had been denied statutory benefits despite the presumption statute. The temporary relief would allow an employee temporary paid leave as per policy.

Staff and City Manager recommended approval.

Councilwoman Ochoa moved to approve Ordinance No. 4610 creating Policy No. 600.09 relating to presumed Illness or Injury for Firefighters). Motion was seconded by Councilman Plata and approved unanimously 4-0.
