Councilman Gus Martinez read the following statement: A public health concern has recently been discovered by UTRGV. Although there has been discussion that this outbreak may have originated within our city limits, it is crucial to understand that this is a county-wide matter and thus the Hidalgo County Health Department will naturally take the lead in this investigation. Our job as a City council is to provide any and all support to the County, assist in their directives, and inform our citizens of all material information needed to not only contain this matter but further ensure the safety and security of our community.
