Due to recent substantial increases in COVID-19 positive cases, and increases in the COVID-19 positivity rate and hospitalizations temporary adjustments to the reopening plan were needed to achieve the lease restrictive means for reducing the growing spread, therefore Executive Order GA-28 was issued by Governor Greg Abbott on June 26, 2020.

Hidalgo County Judge Richard Cortez issued an amendment to Emergency Order (20-008) on June 25, 2020 amending the fifth paragraph under the MOVEMENT OF PEOPLE AND OCCUPANCY OF

PREMISIS and further issued Supplemental Emergency Order (20-010) Additional Covered Entity Guidelines relating to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.

Executive Order GA-28, amendment to Emergency Order (20-008) and Supplemental Emergency Order (20-010) were hereby adopted in their entirety, specifically as to matters that pertained to the city, and remained in effect until the state of disaster was terminated or was to run concurrent with subsequent Executive Orders or Emergency Orders or extensions.

Councilman Alberto Vela moved to approve Resolution # <u>1674</u> of City of Mission of the City Council of the City of Mission Adopting State Of Texas Executive Order GA-28, County of Hidalgo Amendment to County Order (20-008) and Supplemental Emergency Order (20-010) related to the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency.
