I. JOB SUMMARY:

Requires a working knowledge of lifeguarding procedures. Must have flexible hours to be able to work on weekends and afternoons as assigned. Other responsibilities include teaching swimming lessons, enforcing safety policies, and maintaining pool facilities. Individual has no supervisory responsibilities. Instruct children on the correct way to swim, teach fundamentals such as freestyle, Fly, to children of all ages. Individual is responsible for assisting with organizing swimming meets and out of town events with local Parks and Recreation Department, coaches, and organizations within the community. Individual will be assigned other duties as needed by the department head/supervisor.

II. EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS:

- Individual must be a minimum of 17 years of age.
- Requires two (2) years' experience in the capacity of lifeguard.
- Must have excellent swimming skills.
- Must be able to speak the English and Spanish language.
- Lifequard Certificate.

III. EMPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS:

- Applicant must take and pass a drug, physical, and pre-placement screening administered by the City of Mission doctor at the City's expense.
- Applicant will be subject to a complete background investigation. Incomplete, inaccurate and/or failure to report information will cause the applicant rejection from consideration.

IV. SKILL AND ABILITY REQUIREMENTS:

- Ability to use hand tool or machines needed for the work.
- Ability to accept accountability for the accuracy of one's work.
- Ability to deal with and relate to all kinds of people personalities.
- Ability to think clearly and react guickly in emergencies.
- Ability to make decision based on laws and regulations.
- Ability to plan and direct programs and activities of others.
- Ability to identify problems and make decisions based on one's experience and judgment as well as on established facts like budgets and law requirements.
- Ability to accept responsibilities.
- Ability to lift and carry up to 50 lbs.
- Ability to read and interpret documents such as safety rules and city policy procedures.
